observed many baptistries used for rites of purification. At about age 30, John left the monastery for the Jordan River area where Jesus would be baptized. John and Jesus had the same message of repentance which literally means to change one's mind and getting back on the right path through forgiveness of our sins through our baptism.

John 10:31-42 Again, the Jews picked up stones to stone him, but Jesus said to them, "I have shown you many great miracles from the Father. *For which of these do you stone me?* "(v.31 KJV)

In this Scripture, the Jews are failing to believe Jesus is the Christ and are accusing him of blasphemy. He explains to them the miracles he had done should speak for themselves. Also, he tells them that they are not his sheep, or they would believe!

I was in my home office when I heard loud cries from our backyard pool. My 6-year-old daughter came in and calmly said "Bryce, (my 2-year-old son) has drowned." I rushed to the pool where my lifeless son laid after my daughter, a strong swimmer, had pulled him off the pool bottom. Life hurried through my mind, as I sprang into action, first hanging him by his feet letting water gush out of his full lungs. Then after not being comfortable with the new resuscitation method, I took him to the grass yard and preformed the old fashion resuscitation on his back. Ella, our Christian maid at the time, was praying to Jesus for Bryce. I remember thinking of all the brain damaged and fatalities I had seen in my memories, and how now we could join this tragic family experience. However, more importantly, I realized that life is in God's hands as Ella prayed like Elijah for my son's life.

God answered our prayers that day and we're now thankful and proud of our 20-year veteran Marine son.

Psalm 50 For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle unto a thousand hills. For all the fowls of the mountains and the wild beasts of the field are mine. (vv.10-11)

As a veterinarian, I have often been asked the question by my clients, "Will I see my pet in heaven?" As a lifelong Christian, I started my research to find the answer to that question at my retirement fifteen years ago. I studied many religions, read many books and articles on the subject of animal souls and eternal life.

One of my clients recommended I attend a course at her synagogue on the Jewish Kabbalah. Her Rabbi was teaching their view of souls. That religion believes there are three types of souls. First, angel souls, who are God's messengers; second, animal souls, which are sometimes referred to as "earthly angels," who also serve God and man; and lastly, the human soul which alone has a will to decide for good or evil and serve God or not. I'd like to share a couple views that were my favorites since there are as many answers to this question as people. First, Billy Graham, the Evangelist, said, "God will prepare everything for our perfect happiness in heaven and if it takes my dog being there, I believe he'll be there." Also, in Andrew Linsey's book on animal theology, he says the real question is whether you and I, who are neither sinless nor innocent, will be there?

Matthew 3:1-12 This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the LORD, make straight paths for him.'" (v.3)

In May 2014, my wife and I joined members of a Reformed Jewish congregation with their Rabbi, an Episcopal priest, and their wives for a trip to the Holy Land. In preparation for our pilgrimage, I read a book by Adam Hamilton called *The Way*. It paints a picture of walking in the footsteps of Jesus. As I write this installment, we are just starting Lent and the author recalls the events around the relationship of John the Baptist and Jesus, who were cousins. The two boys were six months apart in age, and probably visited each other during yearly Passover. He also notes the family relationship of Elizabeth and Mary and their pregnancies.

Later, John was in a monastic community along the shores of the Dead Sea called Qumran. During our trip, our group visited this site. It is also near where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. In the ruins, we
